It is a land that is a patchwork pattern of federal, state, and private lands, blending uses in ways to conserve and protect the land.

Within the boundary of Black Hills National Forest are several national icons and state treasures that attract visitors from far and near. Places like Mt. Rushmore National Monument, Devils Tower National Monument, and Jewel Cave National Monument are better known. But, no less impressive are Custer State Park, Scenic Needles Highway, Harney Peak, the State Game Loop, Crazy Horse Monument and Wind Cave National Park, just to mention a few. However, the most impressive attraction of the Black Hills National Forest is its splendid scenery.

Along with these national icons, the Forest has reservoirs, campgrounds, picnic areas, two scenic byways, 1,300 miles of streams, 13,000 acres of wilderness, and 353 miles of hiking to off-road vehicle trails. Dotting the 125 mile length and 65 mile width of Black Hills National Forest are developed campgrounds with amenities ranging from only a vault toilet and a hand pump to flush toilets and shoreline boat mooring on the 640-acre Pactola Reservoir.

ForestCamping.com, with its depth of national forest developed campground information, is a good place to start planning a trip to Black Hills National Forest. A unique feature visitors can take advantage of is the number of campgrounds located conveniently close to the area's parks and monuments. Examples of this are Bismarck Lake campground that is a short drive from Custer State Park and campers at Horsethief Lake campground are close enough to hike to Mt. Rushmore National Monument.
